We are thrilled to share our successes in so many different venues across the country. We hope to continue to learn and share exciting developments in our efforts across the many fields of professional work we touch serving families and children. We hope you and other professionals trained in CLFC are also expanding your array of service delivery with CLFC in order to ensure your agency's ongoing ability to serve your community in exciting new ways.

CLFC DVD Recording Complete

After five months of hard work and dedication, COPES has completed the video recording of a full 20-session program run of the *Creating Lasting Family Connections* (CLFC) presented to a group of prison reentry and recovery participants. COPES obtained written permission from each participant prior to shooting the videos. We recorded all 20 2-hour sessions of CLFC from several camera angles, capturing both the trainers' presentation and facilitation skills and the group participants' responses to the training material and the presentation style.

Before and after the completion ceremony on the last program session for this group, we also recorded interviews with graduates and their families who volunteered to share their experience with the CLFC program. Combined, the recorded CLFC program run and the interviews will allow us to maximize our ability to reach as many people as possible in the most cost efficient manner. We have already begun the process of editing the videos for reproduction and use for a variety of purposes, including web-based facilitator training, in-house facilitator training, make up sessions for participants absent from class, and more!

New Referral Agency Partnership Formed

This Spring COPES formed a new key partnership with Dimas Charities, Inc. St. Ann's, a residential treatment facility in Louisville, KY. This new partnership bolsters an already extensive referral network, allowing us to serve more at-risk members of our community. With the help and support of St. Ann's management staff, we quickly launched our first CLFC program and comparison group. As expected, 100% of participants who started this program group graduated this week. We anticipate running a minimum of two cohorts per year at their facility. We really appreciate all the support we receive from the dedicated staff of Dismas Charities, Inc.

COPES Seeking Additional Funding to Expand Services

populations, COPES is applying for funding from multiple funding sources, including both the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA) Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT) and SAMHSA's Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP), the Bureau of Justice Administration (BJA), and others. If funded, these new grants will allow us to greatly expand our current services to the populations at greatest risk in our community. We hope to expand our reentry and recovery support services and open new services for minority women and minority adolescents who are currently aging out of foster care. COPES is planning on teaming up with the Home of the Innocents. Home of the Innocents is the largest single foster provider in the state of Kentucky. We expect to hear about funding in late September. Remember, COPES also provides free grant writing consultation and support for other agencies wishing to use CLFC to address similar populations. Employment Opportunities at COPES
